PRO: Through six NFL seasons, Titans defensive back Vincent Fuller has garnered a reputation as a dedicated worker, fierce competitor and a versatile defender with a knack for being around the ball. He was rewarded during the 2009 offseason with a multi-year contract extension. His full-time role since the beginning of the 2007 season has been as the team's nickel defensive back, while he also maintains significant responsibilities on special teams.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

- In his first six seasons (2005-10), Fuller registered six interceptions, and four of those were returned for touchdowns. He scored twice on interceptions during both the 2007 and 2009 seasons. Fuller's four interception touchdowns rank fourth in team history behind Ken Houston (nine), Miller Farr (five) and Darryll Lewis (five).
- In 2009, Fuller set career highs with three interceptions and seven total passes defended.

TITANS TIDBITS:

- Fuller followed in the footsteps of his cousin Damien Russell by playing for Virginia Tech and then in the NFL. Russell played safety for the Hokies (1988-91) and the San Francisco 49ers (1993).
- During his sophomore year at Virginia Tech, Fuller's cousin Jammal Smoot died in a fatal car accident. The two were very close, and Fuller has stated that not having his cousin in his life has been the most difficult experience he has been forced to overcome.
- After football, Fuller wants to further his education, even possibly attend law school. He also has an interest in coaching high school football.
- Fuller credits his experience as a quarterback at Woodlawn High School in Baltimore, Md., as one of the reasons for his aptitude in understanding offenses.
- Fuller's brother, Kyle, is a starting cornerback at Virginia Tech. Kyle was one of two true freshmen to play for the Hokies in 2010.

CAREER TRANSACTIONS:

- The Baltimore, Md., native was originally selected by the Titans in the fourth round (108th overall) of the 2005 NFL Draft.

SEASON RECAPS:

2010 (12/3): Appeared in 12 games with three starts as the nickel back and collected 32 tackles and an interception. Collected a career-best nine tackles at N.Y. Giants (9/26/10). Was inactive for four games, including the final three contests.

- Against Oakland (9/12), saw action as a reserve at nickel back and posted five tackles, including a tackle for loss and a quarterback pressure. Teamed with Dave Ball to stop Louis Murphy for a five-yard loss on a pass play in the third quarter.
- At N.Y. Giants (9/26), saw action as a reserve as the nickel back and collected a career-high nine tackles.
- Against Denver (10/3), started as the nickel back and notched five tackles and a pass defended. Ended a Broncos' drive by breaking up a third-and-eight pass intended for Demaryius Thomas in the third quarter.
- At Jacksonville (10/18), played in a reserve role as the nickel back and recorded seven tackles and an interception. Ended a potential Jaguars' scoring chance by intercepting a pass intended for Tiquan Underwood in the end zone on a fourth-and-one play in the final stanza.

2009 (13/1): Tied for second on the team with three interceptions, two of which he returned for touchdowns. Also posted 33 tackles, a sack, seven passes defended and four special teams tackles on coverage units. Led

or tied for the team lead in passes defended four times (at PIT, at SF, vs. BUF, vs. STL).

- At Pittsburgh (9/10), collected three tackles, including one for a loss, and an interception. Ended a Steelers' drive by intercepting a Ben Roethlisberger pass intended for Santonio Holmes in the first quarter and stopped Willie Parker for a three-yard loss in the third quarter.
- At N.Y. Jets (9/27), left the game late in the first quarter with an arm injury, which caused him to be inactive the next three games.
- At San Francisco (11/8), deflected a pass intended for Josh Morgan that was then intercepted by Cortland Finnegan and returned 39 yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter.
- Against Buffalo (11/15), recorded an interception that was returned for a touchdown in the Titans' 41-17 win. Stepped in front of Josh Reed, intercepted the Trent Edwards pass and raced 26 yards for a touchdown, giving the Titans a commanding 34-17 lead with 2:54 remaining in the fourth quarter.
- At Houston (11/23), dropped Matt Schaub for a seven-yard sack in the second quarter, his second career sack.
- At Indianapolis (12/6), matched a then career high with eight tackles.
- At St. Louis (12/13), collected a career-best four passes defended, including an interception returned for a touchdown in the Titans' commanding 47-7 victory. Intercepted a pass intended for Brandon Gibson and raced 45 yards for a touchdown with 5:44 remaining in the fourth quarter.

2008 (16/1, 1/0): Played in 16 games as team's nickel defensive back and posted career high with 43 tackles. Also contributed four passes defended, one forced fumble and six special teams tackles.

- Against Houston (9/21), registered four tackles, including teaming with Cortland Finnegan to stonewall Steve Slaton for one-yard gain on fourth-and-four in third quarter.
- Against Minnesota (9/28), tied for team lead with season-high seven tackles. Registered forced fumble on defense and added special teams stop.
- Against Indianapolis (10/27), notched three tackles and two passes defended on Monday Night Football. Halted Colts' opening drive by batting down third-down pass intended for Reggie Wayne. Made another third-down stop by deflecting Peyton Manning pass that was intercepted by Chris Hope in second quarter.
- Against Green Bay (11/2), made first career NFL start as nickel back and posted two tackles in overtime victory.
- Against Baltimore (1/10), posted one tackle in Divisional playoff.

2007 (16/0, 1/0): Played in 16 games as team's nickel defensive back and posted then-career highs in tackles (35), interceptions (two), passes defended (four), sacks (one) and quarterback pressures (three). Added five stops on special teams.

- At New Orleans (9/24), collected first career interception when he snared a Drew Brees pass intended for Lance Moore and returned it 61 yards for a touchdown with 2:39 remaining in fourth quarter.
- Against Atlanta (10/7), picked off Joey Harrington pass and returned it 76 yards for a go-ahead touchdown. Became first NFL player to record consecutive games with interception return for touchdown since Darren Sharper, who accomplished feat in final game of 2004 season (1/2/05) and first game of 2005 season (9/11/05).
- In Wild Card Game at San Diego (1/6), recorded two tackles in playoff debut.

2006 (16/0): Played in all 16 games and posted 15 tackles, two quarterback pressures, two passes defended and two forced fumbles in a reserve role
