PRO: A big, athletic target with the ability to stretch the field, Justin Gage is the veteran leader of the Titans' receiving corps. He enters his ninth NFL season and fifth campaign with the Titans. The Titans rely upon his athleticism and ability to line up in the slot or on the outside, making him a dangerous pass catcher. The former Chicago Bear has enjoyed the most successful seasons of his career in Tennessee, including 2008, when his 19.1-yard receiving average ranked third in the NFL. He is a natural athlete who played three years on Missouri's basketball team and switched from quarterback to wide receiver prior to his sophomore year of college.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

- In 2010, the 6-foot-4-inch, 212-pound receiver caught 20 passes for 266 yards and one touchdown.
- In 2008, he caught 34 passes for a team-best 651 yards and a career-high six touchdowns.
- In a win at Jacksonville on Nov. 16, 2008, he set career highs with 147 receiving yards and two touchdowns (touchdown mark matched vs. Miami on Dec. 20, 2009).
- During his first season with the Titans in 2007, he led the club with a career-high 750 receiving yards and tied for the team lead with a career-best 55 receptions.
- Gage's first four NFL seasons were spent in Chicago, where he contributed 64 receptions for 908 yards (14.2 avg.) and four touchdowns in 49 games (16 starts).

TITANS TIDBITS:

- During the 2008 offseason, Gage founded the Twelve Starz Foundation, which benefits underprivileged youth in his hometown of Jefferson City, Mo.
- Gage was still relatively new to the receiver position when he entered the NFL in 2003. He converted from quarterback prior to his sophomore year at Missouri. In high school, he played quarterback and earned all-state honors as a defensive back.
- Gage's first career touchdown pass at Missouri was a one-yard toss to former Titans tight end Dwayne Blakley against Texas A&M (11/13/99).
- The multi-talented Gage was a two-sport standout at Missouri. For his first three years of college, he played in a total of 73 games with the basketball team and averaged 2.1 points and 2.9 rebounds per game. He decided prior to his senior year to focus strictly on football.
- For five years, Gage has co-hosted an offseason youth football camp at Concordia University Chicago with former Chicago Bears guard and second cousin Revie Sorey. He held his first football camp in Jefferson City in 2009.

CAREER TRANSACTIONS:

- The Jefferson City, Mo., native was originally selected by the Chicago Bears in the fifth-round (143rd overall) in the 2003 NFL Draft.
- Signed by the Titans as an unrestricted free agent on March 23, 2007.

SEASON RECAPS:

2010 (11/5 – Tennessee): Appeared in 11 games with five starts and collected 20 receptions for 266 yards with a touchdown. Led the team in receiving yards three times in 2010 (vs. PIT, at NYG, at HST). Tied for the team lead in receptions twice in 2010 (at NYG, at HST). He was inactive for five contests.

- Against Pittsburgh (9/19), led the team with 74 receiving yards on four receptions. Got open deep and hauled in a 30-yard pass from Kerry Collins late in the fourth quarter.

- At N.Y. Giants (9/26), tied for the team lead with three receptions for a team-best 39 receiving yards.
- Against Denver (10/3), grabbed two receptions for 30 yards before leaving the game in the second quarter with a hamstring injury, which kept him out of the next four games.
- At Houston (11/28), tied for the team lead with four receptions for a team-best 50 yards.
- Against Houston (12/19), scored on a one-yard touchdown toss by Kerry Collins on fourth-and-goal during the opening stanza.

2009 (12/10 – Tennessee): Appeared in 12 games with 10 starts and caught 28 passes for 383 yards with three touchdowns. Missed four consecutive games after suffering a back injury at San Francisco (11/8/09). Tied a career-high with two touchdown receptions against Miami (12/20/09). Led or tied for the team lead in receptions three times in 2009 (at PIT, at NYJ, at SF) and led the team in receiving yards twice (vs. JAX, at SF).

- At Pittsburgh (9/10), led the team and tied a career-high with seven receptions for 78 yards and a touchdown. Tied the game at 7-7 with a 14-yard touchdown grab with 48 seconds left in the second quarter.
- At San Francisco (11/8), led the team with four receptions and 97 receiving yards in the Titans' 34-27 victory. Got behind the defense and hauled in a 49-yard reception in the first quarter. Made an acrobatic, leaping 33-yard reception over the middle helping set up the Titans' go-ahead score in the fourth quarter.
- Against Miami (12/20), saw action as a reserve at wide receiver and caught two passes for 43 yards with two touchdowns in the Titans' 27-24 overtime win. Gave the Titans a 7-3 lead with a 22-yard touchdown catch in the back of the end zone on third-and-five with 6:35 remaining in the first quarter. Got open in the corner of the end zone for a 21-yard touchdown reception, giving the Titans a 17-6 halftime lead.

2008 (12/11, 1/1 – Tennessee): Saw action in 12 games with 11 starts at wide receiver and finished with 34 receptions for a team-high 651 receiving yards and a career-best six touchdown catches. His 19.1-yard receiving average ranked third in the NFL and the 34 receptions ranked fourth on the team and were the second-highest total of his career. Set a single-game career-high with 147 receiving yards and two touchdowns at Jacksonville (11/16). Posted 10 receptions for 135 yards in the Wild Card game against Baltimore (1/10). His yardage total ranks second in team playoff history, trailing only Ernest Givins' 136-yard effort against the Pittsburgh Steelers (12/31/89). His 10 receptions tied for second place in team playoff history, matching Frank Wycheck's total against Pittsburgh (1/11/03) and trailing only Givins' 11 receptions against the Steelers (12/31/89). During the regular season led or tied for the team lead in receptions five times (at CIN, vs. MIN, at JAX, at DET, at HST) and led the team in receiving yards five times (at CIN, vs. MIN, at JAX, at HST, vs. PIT).

- At Cincinnati (9/14), led the team with five receptions, 59 receiving yards and a touchdown in the 24-7 road victory. Gave the Titans a 14-7 lead with an 11-yard touchdown grab with 38 seconds remaining in the second quarter.
- Against Minnesota (9/28), led the team with five receptions and 92 receiving yards in the Titans' 30-17 victory. Snared a 28-yard completion during the Titans' third scoring drive early in the second quarter. Two plays later, hauled in a 25-yard pass deep down the right sideline. Converted a key fourth-and-two with a two-yard grab, setting up a first-and-goal scoring opportunity in the second quarter.
- At Chicago (11/9), grabbed four receptions for 47 yards and a touchdown

in the Titans' 21-14 road win. Gave the Titans a 14-7 lead with a 12-yard touchdown reception on third-and-three in the third quarter.

- At Jacksonville (11/16), snared four receptions for a career-high 147 yards and two touchdowns in the Titans' 24-14 come-from-behind victory. Got open down the left sideline and hauled in a 47-yard reception on the opening play of the game. Gave the Titans a 17-14 lead by hauling in a 56-yard touchdown toss down the left sideline in the third quarter. Sealed the victory with his second touchdown reception of the afternoon, a 38-yarder with 3:57 left to play in the fourth quarter.
- Against Pittsburgh (12/21), grabbed five receptions for a team-high 104 receiving yards with a touchdown in the Titans' 31-14 victory. Hauled in a 26-yard reception deep over the middle during the first quarter. Gave the Titans a 10-0 lead with a 34-yard touchdown reception on third-and-five in the second quarter. Extended a Titans' scoring drive in the third quarter with a 21-yard catch on third-and-eight. Kept a Titans' scoring drive alive with a 17-yard reception along the sideline on fourth-and-three late in the third quarter.
- In the Divisional playoffs against Baltimore (1/10), led the team with a game-high 10 receptions and 135 receiving yards. Set up the Titans first touchdown with a 20-yard reception down to the Ravens' eight-yard line.

2007 (16/8, 1/1 – Tennessee): Saw action in all 16 games with eight starts. Started the final seven games of the regular season and tied for the team lead with 55 receptions, while leading the team with 750 receiving yards. Of Gage's 55 receptions, 45 of them – 81.8 percent – resulted in first downs. That was the third-highest percentage in the NFL among qualifying players (min. 32 receptions), behind only Terrell Owens (85.2 percent) and Brandon Stokley (85.0). Led or tied for the team lead in receptions six times in 2007 (at JAX, vs. OAK, vs. JAX, at DEN, vs. HST, at IND). Led the team in receiving yards seven times in 2007 (at JAX, at TB, vs. OAK, vs. JAX, at DEN, at CIN, at IND). Tied for the team lead in special teams tackles once in 2007 (at NO). Set a career-high with 104 receiving yards on seven receptions against Indianapolis (12/30).

- Against Jacksonville (11/11), led the team with seven receptions and 90 receiving yards, while grabbing his first touchdown in a Titans' uniform. Made a juggling catch in the end zone for a 20-yard touchdown reception on third-and-nine in the fourth quarter.
- At Cincinnati (11/25), led the team with 98 receiving yards on four catches, including a career-best 73-yard reception.
- At Indianapolis (12/30), led the team and matched a career-best with seven receptions for a career-high 104 receiving yards in the Titans' 16-10 playoff-clinching victory.

2006 (8/0, 1/0 – Chicago): Played eight games in final season with Bears and totaled four receptions for 68 yards. Was inactive for eight contests.

- Against Miami (11/5), totaled season-high 51 yards on two receptions, including 34-yarder.

2005 (15/11, 1/1 – Chicago): Set new career high with 11 starts in 15 total games with Bears. As second receiver for most of season, registered career-best marks for receptions (31) and yards (346) while tying previous best with two touchdown receptions. Led team by recording first downs on 22-of-31 receptions (71.0%). Paced Bears in receptions in four games while leading the team in receiving yards in two contests. Inactive in one game (10/23 against Baltimore).

- Against Carolina (11/20), set new career high with seven catches for team-high 81 yards.
- In Divisional Playoff against Carolina (1/15/06), recorded three receptions for 28 yards, including 24-yard reception.

2004 (16/2 – Chicago): Appeared in 16 games with Bears and started two contests. Ranked sixth on team with 156 yards on 12 receptions, including three receptions of 20 yards or longer.

- At Tampa Bay (10/24), led Bears with four receptions for 43 yards.

2003 (10/3 – Chicago): Led Bears with 19.9-yards receiving average as rookie. Registered 17 receptions for 338 yards and two touchdowns in 10 games (three starts). Five of first six career receptions went for more than 20 yards. Inactive for season's first five games and for season finale against Kansas City (12/28) with knee injury.

- At Seattle (10/19), made NFL debut and registered two receptions for 26 yards, including 21-yard catch.

- Against Arizona (11/30), recorded season high with 100 yards on four receptions, including long of 57 yards.

COLLEGE:

- Three-time All-Big 12 Conference selection at Missouri started each of team's 34 games during final three years, finishing with 200 career catches for 2,704 yards and 18 touchdowns while leading the team in receiving each season.
- Also passed for 258 yards by completing 18 of 49 passes with four touchdowns before switching from quarterback to receiver prior to sophomore season.
- As senior, named first-team All-Big 12 after leading team with single-season school record 82 receptions for 1,075 yards and nine touchdowns.
- As junior, ranked 13th in NCAA with 6.8 receptions per game, posted team-high 74 receptions (third-highest total in school history) and gained 920 yards receiving (fifth-best in team annals) with five touchdowns. Earned consensus first-team all-Big 12 honors.
- Scheduled to redshirt as freshman, but was forced into action at quarterback in final three games and completed 14 of 41 passes for 138 yards and two touchdowns.
- Majored in business at Missouri.

PERSONAL:

- Married to Joy Carter, the couple splits time between Nashville and St. Louis, Mo. Has a son, Justin Corde Gage.
- Standout quarterback at Jefferson City (Mo.) High School added second-team all-state honors as defensive back. Passed for 1,148 yards and 21 touchdowns while rushing for 702 yards and 12 touchdowns as senior.
- Also lettered in basketball in high school.
- Took part in Titans Caravan 2008 in April visiting fans in Lebanon, Gallatin, Bowling Green and White House.
- Active with Boys & Girls Club in Jefferson City.
