PRO: The Titans entered the 2017 NFL free agency period looking to add leadership and experience to their secondary. The club found just that when they signed two-time Super Champion Logan Ryan as an unrestricted free agent on March 11, 2017. The 5-foot-11-inch, 195-pounder arrived in Tennessee having collected 14 total interceptions in four seasons (2013-16) with the New England Patriots. The Rutgers product was originally drafted by the Patriots in the third round (83rd overall) of the 2013 NFL Draft.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

- Ryan is a two-time Super Bowl champion, having captured the title with the New England Patriots in 2014 and 2016.
- In 2016, Ryan posted 92 tackles, two interceptions, a sack, 11 passes defended, three quarterback pressures and a forced fumble. He started all three postseason games and collected 22 tackles, an interception, a sack, four passes defended and a quarterback hit.
- In 2015, Ryan collected 82 tackles, a team-high four interceptions and 14 passes defended.
- In 2013, Ryan led all rookies and finished tied for the AFC lead with five interceptions.

TITANS TIDBITS:

- While taking wedding photos in the St. Lucian town of Soufriere, Logan and his wife, Ashley, came across a bunch of stray dogs. One dog in particular followed them through the streets and impacted the couple. When the newlyweds flew back home, they were determined to help in any way possible. The couple donated money to @helpaws, a St. Lucian-based dog rescue, and encouraged all friends and family that instead of giving wedding gifts to make donations. The company later reached out and based on a picture the couple posted on social media, they found the particular dog, named her Logan, and part of the donation paid for her spay.
- During the 2017 offseason, Ryan and N.Y. Giants cornerback Eli Apple hosted their first #ThursdayNightLights Football Camp on June 29. The free event for ages 8-18 was funded by the two Eastern High School grads. The night was filled with football, celebrity guests, music, and took place on the high school field where both players put in countless hours to get to where they are today.
- In June 2017, Ryan surprised his big brother, Jordan, by paying off his student loans for his 29th birthday. Logan cut a check for \$82,000 to the American Education Services to cover Jordan's loans from earning his engineering degree from Drexel University. "My man got accepted to college, graduated with honors, and now works as an engineer. He did everything the right way and still lived with a ridiculous amount of student loan debt. The system is broke and makes no sense. I'm fortunate and blessed to be able to take care of that for him."
- When Ryan decided to leave Rutgers and enter the NFL Draft after his redshirt junior season in 2012, he made a promise to his parents that after his rookie year, he would return to school and earn his degree. Ryan kept his promise and graduated in the spring of 2014 with a degree in labor relations and a minor in psychology. "I committed to Rutgers, not only as a football player, but as a student, so I was going to make sure I finished that end too. It's a big accomplishment in my life. I held my word to my parents and stuck with it and I'm fortunate. It took a lot of work, but I was able to go back and finish and walk in graduation."

CAREER TRANSACTIONS:

- The Voorhees, N.J., native was originally selected by the New England Patriots in the third round (83rd overall) of the 2013 NFL Draft.
- Signed by the Titans as an unrestricted free agent on March 11, 2017.

SEASON RECAPS:

2017 (15/15, 2/2 - Tennessee): Started 15 games at cornerback in his first season with the Titans and ranked third on the team with 14 passes defended. Registered 73 tackles, two quarterback pressures, two stops for loss and a forced fumble. Was inactive for one contest. Started at cornerback in both postseason contests and tallied 12 tackles, a pass defended and a stop for loss. Led or tied for the team lead in passes defended three times in 2017 (vs. SEA, vs. IND, vs. HOU). Led the team in tackles once in 2017 (at NE).

- Against Oakland (9/10), started at cornerback in his Titans debut and posted four tackles and a forced fumble. Forced an Amari Cooper fumble that went out of bounds in the third quarter.
- At Jacksonville (9/17), started at cornerback and collected eight tackles.
- Against Seattle (9/24), started at cornerback and notched eight tackles and a team-high three passes defended. Broke up a first-and-goal pass intended for Doug Baldwin late in the second quarter. Batted down a pass intended for Jimmy Graham in the end zone in the fourth quarter. Knocked down a third-and-six pass intended for Tyler Lockett in the fourth quarter.
- At Houston (10/1), started at cornerback and tallied six tackles. Stuffed D'Onta Foreman for no gain on a rush off left guard in the final stanza.
- At Miami (10/8), started at cornerback and totaled two tackles, including a stop for loss. Ended a Dolphins' drive by stopping Jakeem Grant for a one-yard loss on a short, third-and-17 yard pass in the third stanza. Combined with Derrick Morgan to stuff Jay Ajayi for a two-yard loss on a rush off right tackle in the fourth quarter.
- Against Indianapolis (10/16), started at cornerback and recorded three tackles, a team-high two passes defended and a stop for loss. Halted a Colts' drive by knocking down a third-and-six pass intended for T.Y. Hilton in the third quarter. Stonewalled Robert Turbin for a three-yard loss on a rush up the middle in the fourth quarter. Broke up a pass intended for Jack Doyle late in the final stanza.
- At Cleveland (10/22), started at cornerback and posted two tackles.
- Against Baltimore (11/5), started at cornerback and collected seven tackles and three passes defended. Broke up a deep pass intended for Breshad Perriman in the opening quarter. Jarred loose a pass intended for Perriman and the ball was corralled by Kevin Byard for an interception in the first stanza.
- Against Cincinnati (11/12), started at cornerback and recorded five tackles and a pass defended. Ended a Bengals' drive by breaking up a pass intended for A.J. Green on third-and-11 in the third quarter.
- At Pittsburgh (11/16), started at cornerback and notched seven tackles and two passes defended. Broke up a deep pass intended for Martavis Bryant in the second quarter.
- At Indianapolis (11/26), started at cornerback in his 75th career game and registered four tackles and two quarterback pressures.
- Against Houston (12/3), started at cornerback and produced six tackles and a team-best three passes defended before leaving the game in the third quarter with an injury. Broke up a pass intended for DeAndre Hopkins in the end zone in the first quarter. Deflected a deep pass intended for Hopkins in the third quarter.
- At Arizona (12/10), started at cornerback and tallied seven tackles.
- At San Francisco (12/17), started at cornerback and posted four tackles before leaving the game in the second quarter with an injury.
- Against Los Angeles Rams (12/24), was inactive.
- Against Jacksonville (12/31), started at cornerback.
- At Kansas City (1/6), started at cornerback and recorded a stop for loss.
- At New England (1/13), started at cornerback and led the team with 11 tackles and a pass defended. Combined with Johnathan Cyprien to stuff

Dion Lewis for a one-yard loss on a rush off right guard in the first quarter.

2016 (16/13, 3/3 - New England): Saw action in all 16 games with 13 starts and amassed 92 tackles, two interceptions, a sack, 11 passes defended, three quarterback pressures and a forced fumble. Started all three postseason games and collected 22 tackles, an interception, a sack, four passes defended and a quarterback hit.

- Against Miami (9/18), finished second on the team with seven tackles and a forced fumble at the Miami 46 that was recovered by Chris Long in the win.
- Against Buffalo (10/2), led the team with a career-best 17 tackles.
- At San Francisco (11/20), recorded three tackles and two passes defended starting at right cornerback in the win.
- At N.Y. Jets (11/27), led the team with seven tackles and added two passes defended in the win.
- Against Los Angeles (12/4), sacked quarterback Jared Goff for a loss of 12.5 yards in the second quarter of the win for his first sack since he recorded 1.5 sacks as a rookie in 2013.
- At Denver (12/18), led the team with seven tackles while also adding an interception and a pass defended in the win.
- At Miami (1/1), started at cornerback and had a team-leading seven tackles to go along with an interception and a pass defended in the win.
- Against Houston (1/14), picked off Brock Osweiler for a 23-yard return in the fourth quarter of the Divisional Round game. Added a five-yard sack of Osweiler to go along with seven total tackles and three passes defended.
- Against Pittsburgh (1/22), started at cornerback and led the team with nine tackles, while also contributing a pass defense in the AFC Championship game.
- Against Atlanta (2/5), started at cornerback and tied for the team lead with six tackles in the victory over the Falcons in Super Bowl LI.

2015 (16/14, 2/2 - New England): Played in all 16 regular season contests with 14 starts at cornerback and accumulated 82 tackles, a team-high four interceptions and 14 passes defended. Started both playoff games and accumulated 14 tackles and one pass defended.

- At Buffalo (9/20), registered four tackles and an interception late in the fourth quarter that helped New England seal the victory.
- At Indianapolis (10/18), started at right cornerback, and played every defensive snap in the win while recording a single-game, career-high 11 tackles and one pass defended.
- Against Miami (10/29), started at right cornerback and recorded eight tackles, one pass defended and an interception that set up a Patriots field goal in the win.
- Against Kansas City (1/16), made his first postseason start and recorded nine tackles in the Divisional playoff victory.

2014 (16/6, 3/0 - New England): Played all 16 regular season games with six starts and compiled 36 tackles, two interceptions, six passes defended, one forced fumble and eight special teams tackles. Appeared in all three playoff games as a reserve and made four tackles, one pass defended and forced one fumble.

- At Miami (9/7), rotated in at defensive back in the season opener and forced his second career fumble that was recovered by Darrelle Revis in Patriots territory to prevent a Miami scoring drive.
- At Minnesota (9/14), started at cornerback and recorded his first interception of the season off Matt Cassel that led to a Patriots field goal in the win.
- Against Detroit (11/23), intercepted a Matthew Stafford pass intended for Golden Tate in the win.
- Against Baltimore (1/10), posted one tackle and forced a fumble in the AFC Divisional win.
- Against Seattle (2/1), posted one tackle and one pass defended in the Super Bowl XLIX win.

2013 (16/7, 2/0 - New England): Played all 16 regular season games with seven starts and posted 41 tackles, 1.5 sacks, five interceptions for 82 return yards and one touchdown, 10 passes defended and one forced fumble. Played in both postseason games as a reserve and registered 12 tackles. Led all NFL rookies and tied for the AFC lead with a team-high five interceptions.

- Against New Orleans (10/13), made his first career start.
- At N.Y. Jets (10/20), returned his first career interception 79 yards for a touchdown. Also collected four tackles.
- Against Miami (10/27), forced a fumble on his first NFL sack. Strip-sacked Ryan Tannehill, forcing a fumble that was recovered by Rob

Ninkovich deep in Miami territory. New England scored a touchdown three plays later. Finished the game with four tackles, 1.5 sacks for 18 yards, one pass defended and one forced fumble.

- Against Denver (11/24), started as the nickel cornerback and intercepted a Peyton Manning pass early in the fourth quarter that led to a touchdown. Also posted four tackles.
- At Houston (12/1), intercepted a pass for the second straight game and made three tackles.
- At Baltimore (12/22), picked off two passes for the first two interception game of his career. The offense turned the interceptions into 10 points en route to a 41-7 win.

COLLEGE:

- Started 27 of 37 games at cornerback for Rutgers and recorded 170 career tackles with a half sack, 11 stops for losses of 49 yards and a quarterback pressure. Also forced two fumbles and recovered four others, returning one 18 yards. Deflected 39 passes and made seven interceptions for 73 yards in returns, including one touchdown.
- Earned first team All-American honors (Pro Football Weekly) and second-team All-America accolades from The NFL Draft Report, All-Big East Conference.
- As a junior (2012), started all 13 games, recording 94 tackles, 17 pass breakups and four interceptions. Named to All-Big East first team at cornerback and was named a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award, given annually to college football's top defensive back. Earned Axe Player of the Year at RU banquet. Was a three-time member of the Big East All-Academic Football Team.
- As a sophomore (2011), started all 13 games and recorded 67 tackles, including 5.5 tackles for loss and a half sack. Named All-Big East second team for his efforts. Was a member of the Big East All-Academic Football Team.
- As a redshirt freshman (2010), appeared in 11 games at cornerback and posted nine tackles. Named a member of the Big East All-Academic Football Team.
- In 2009, reshirted in his first year with the Scarlet Knights.
- Majored in labor studies at Rutgers.

PERSONAL:

- Married to Ashley, and the couple has a daughter, Avery.
- Played both quarterback and cornerback at Eastern High School. Was rated the No. 1 cornerback in New Jersey by Rivals.com and ranked as the No. 9 overall prospect in New Jersey by Rivals.com and the No. 15 cornerback prospect nationally by ESPN.com.
- As a senior, threw for 1,070 yards and eight touchdowns and rushed for 699 yards and nine touchdowns while running a spread offense. Also tallied 43 tackles, two tackles for loss and five interceptions in earning South Jersey Player of the Year Defensive honors from the Philadelphia Inquirer.
- During his final two scholastic campaigns, Ryan threw for more than 2,500 yards and accounted for 35 total touchdowns in guiding Eastern to a 16-5 record and consecutive state playoff berths.
