**PRO:** The Titans signed Wesley Woodyard during the 2014 unrestricted free agency period, adding veteran leadership to the linebacking corps. Following his career at the University of Kentucky, the 6-foot, 233-pounder went undrafted and signed a free agent contract with the Denver Broncos. Woodyard spent six seasons in Denver and appeared 87 career regular season games, totaling 396 tackles, eight sacks, five interceptions, six forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. He was also a six-time team captain during his tenure with the Broncos.

### CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

- In 2016, Woodyard saw action in all 16 games and ranked second on the team with 88 tackles, while leading the squad with seven tackles for loss.
- In 2015, Woodyard finished second on the team with 110 tackles and third on the squad with five sacks.
- In his first season with the Titans in 2014, Woodyard started all 16 games at linebacker and led the team with a career-high 134 tackles.
- Represented the only player in the NFL in 2012 — and just the 12th player in the last 30 years — to record at least 100 tackles, five sacks and three interceptions in a single season. Posted career highs in starts (14), tackles (114), sacks (5.5), interceptions (3), passes defended (6) and fumble recoveries (1).
- In 2011, started seven games for the Broncos and finished second on the club with 87 tackles to go along with two passes defended and two forced fumbles.
- In 2008, was the only Bronco to rank among the top eight on the team in both defensive tackles (54 - 8th) and special-teams stops (11 - T1st) while seeing time in all 16 games with six starts as a rookie.

### TITANS TIDBITS:

- Woodyard has been a captain in his first three seasons with the Titans. He joined Hall of Fame running back Floyd Little as the only players in Broncos franchise history to serve as a captain in each of their first five years with the club. In 2004, Woodyard also became the first-ever Kentucky freshman to serve as a team captain.
- Woodyard is the co-founder of The 16Ways Foundation which recognizes an emotional need for at-risk youth. The Foundation works on a national level to develop and implement workshops, seminars, camps, and other activities. These events are designed to build self-esteem, promote responsibility for one's own actions and overcoming obstacles, and demonstrate the importance of academics, knowledge of career options, professional development, community involvement, and mental and physical fitness among youth of all socio-economic backgrounds. The Foundation's primary focus is to work with at-risk youth between the ages of 8 and 18 and a secondary focus on adults in employment transition.
- During the 2016 and 2017 offseasons, Woodyard's 16Ways Foundation hosted a youth football and cheer camp, as well as a charity golf outing in Lexington, Ky.
- Woodyard was a three-time nominee for the Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year while with the Broncos in 2010-11 and 2013.

### CAREER TRANSACTIONS:

- The LaGrange, Ga., native was originally signed by the Denver Broncos as a rookie free agent on April 28, 2008.
- Signed by the Titans as an unrestricted free agent on March 14, 2014.

### SEASON RECAPS:

**2017 (16/16, 2/2 - Tennessee):** Started all 16 games at linebacker and

led the team with a career-high 172 tackles and 17 stops for loss. His 172 tackles ranked second by a defender in the franchise's "Titans era" (1999-present). Ranked fourth on the squad with five sacks. Posted 15 quarterback pressures, five passes defended, two fumble recoveries and three special teams tackles. Started at linebacker in both postseason contests and collected 10 tackles, a half sack, a quarterback pressure and a stop for loss. Led or tied for the team lead in tackles 11 times in 2017 (vs. OAK, at JAX, vs. SEA, at HOU, vs. IND, vs. BAL, vs. CIN, vs. HOU, at ARZ, at SF, at KC). Led or tied for the team lead in sacks three times in 2017 (vs. OAK, vs. IND, at SF). Led the team in passes defended once in 2017 (at MIA). Led the team in quarterback pressures once in 2017 (vs. IND). Notched a career-high 20 tackles against Baltimore (11/5/17), which is the most by a defender in the Titans era. Played in his 150th career regular season game against the Los Angeles Rams (12/24/17).

- Against Oakland (9/10), started at linebacker and tied for the team lead with 10 tackles, including a sack, a stop for loss and a quarterback pressure. Dropped Derek Carr for a five-yard sack in the second quarter.
- At Jacksonville (9/17), started at linebacker. Led the team and tied a career-best with 15 tackles, including a stop for loss. Teamed with Adoree' Jackson to stuff Leonard Fournette for a one-yard loss on a rush off right end in the opening quarter. Stopped Chris Ivory for a two-yard loss on a short pass in the third quarter.
- Against Seattle (9/24), started at linebacker and notched a team-best 13 tackles, including two tackles for loss and three quarterback pressures. Stuffed Chris Carson for no gain on a rush off right tackle in the opening quarter. Stonewalled Carson for a one-yard loss on a rush off right tackle in the third stanza. Stopped C.J. Prosise for a one-yard loss on a rush off left guard late in the third quarter.
- At Houston (10/1), started at linebacker and led the team with 12 tackles, including a stop for loss and a quarterback pressure. Combined with Nate Palmer to stuff Lamar Miller for a one-yard loss on a rush off left tackle in the third quarter. Teamed with Austin Johnson to stop Alfred Blue for no gain on a rush off right guard in the final stanza.
- At Miami (10/8), started at linebacker and totaled nine tackles, including a stop for loss and a team-best two passes defended. Stuffed Jay Ajayi for no gain on a rush off left tackle in the first quarter. Deflected a pass intended for Anthony Fasano that was then intercepted by Tye Smith in the second quarter. Broke up a pass intended for Julius Thomas late in the third quarter.
- Against Indianapolis (10/16), started at linebacker and led the team with 11 tackles, a sack, two quarterback pressures and a fumble recovery. Recovered a Jack Doyle fumble that was forced by Avery Williamson in the third quarter. Forced a critical intentional grounding penalty with a rush up the middle in the fourth quarter. Halted a potential Colts' scoring drive by forcing Jacoby Brissett out of bounds for a sack on fourth-and-one late in the fourth quarter.
- At Cleveland (10/22), started at linebacker and posted 12 tackles.
- Against Baltimore (11/5), started at linebacker and led the team with a career-high 20 tackles, which is the most by a defender in the Titans era. Posted three stops for loss, a quarterback pressure and a pass defended. Teamed with Brian Orakpo to stuff Alex Collins for a one-yard loss on a rush off left tackle in the second quarter. Batted down a pass intended for Benjamin Watson in the third quarter. Ended a Ravens' drive by stopping Bobby Rainey for a one-yard loss on a short third-and-three pass in the third quarter. Combined with Adoree' Jackson to stuff Benjamin Watson for a one-yard loss on a short pass in the third stanza. Halted a potential Ravens' scoring drive by stonewalling Javorius Allen for no gain on a critical fourth-and-one rush up the middle in the fourth quarter.
- Against Cincinnati (11/12), started at linebacker and led the team with

nine tackles and a pass defended. Posted two special teams tackles on coverage units. Broke up a pass intended for Tyler Kroft in the third quarter.

- At Pittsburgh (11/16), started at linebacker and notched three tackles and a quarterback pressure.
- At Indianapolis (11/26), started at linebacker and registered 10 tackles, including a sack and three quarterback pressures. Dropped Jacoby Brissett for a sack in the second quarter. Combined with Avery Williamson to stonewall Frank Gore for a one-yard loss on a rush off right guard in the third quarter.
- Against Houston (12/3), started at linebacker and led the team with 15 tackles, including a stop for loss and a quarterback pressure. Combined with Jurrell Casey to stuff Andre Ellington for a one-yard loss on a rush off left tackle in the second stanza.
- At Arizona (12/10), started at linebacker and tied for the team lead with 10 tackles, including a sack, a quarterback pressure and four stops for loss. Stuffed Kerwynn Williams for a one-yard loss on a rush off right tackle in the second quarter. Dropped Blaine Gabbert for an eight-yard sack in the third stanza. Stopped Williams for no gain on a rush up the middle in the fourth quarter. Stonewalled D.J. Foster for a four-yard loss on a third-and-13 screen pass late in the fourth quarter.
- At San Francisco (12/17), started at linebacker and led the team with 12 tackles, including a sack, two stops for loss and a quarterback pressure. Stopped Jimmy Garoppolo for a six-yard loss after the signal caller hauled in his own batted ball in the fourth quarter. Sacked Jimmy Garoppolo for a 10-yard loss on a third-and-11 in the fourth quarter.
- Against Los Angeles Rams (12/24), started at linebacker in his 150th career regular season contest and notched four tackles and a fumble recovery for a touchdown. Recovered a Jared Goff fumble that was forced by Jurrell Casey and returned it four yards for a touchdown with 5:20 left to play in the second quarter.
- Against Jacksonville (12/31), started at linebacker and tallied seven tackles and a pass defended. Posted a special teams tackle on coverage units. Broke up a pass intended for Leonard Fournette in the second quarter.
- At Kansas City (1/6), started at linebacker and tied for the team lead with eight tackles, including a half sack, a stop for loss and a quarterback pressure. Teamed with Brian Orakpo to drop Alex Smith for an eight-yard sack in the second quarter. Combined with Avery Williamson to stuff Kareem Hunt for a one-yard loss on a rush off right end in the third quarter.
- At New England (1/13), started at linebacker and registered two tackles. Combined with Austin Johnson to stuff Dion Lewis for a three-yard loss on a short pass in the third quarter.

**2016 (16/10 - Tennessee):** Played in all 16 games with 10 starts at linebacker and ranked second on the team with 88 tackles. Led the squad with seven tackles for loss. Registered two sacks, an interception, eight quarterback pressures and six passes defended. Collected six special teams tackles on coverage units. Led or tied for the team lead in tackles twice in 2016 (at SD, at KC). Led or tied for the team lead in sacks twice in 2016 (vs. CLE, at SD). Led or tied for the team lead in passes defended twice in 2016 (at MIA, at CHI). Tied for the team lead in special teams tackles twice in 2016 (vs. MIN, at IND).

- Against Minnesota (9/11), started at linebacker and collected six tackles, two quarterback pressures and a pass defended. Notched a special teams tackle on coverage units.
- At Detroit (9/18), saw significant action as a reserve at linebacker and posted eight tackles. Teamed with Angelo Blackson to stuff Theo Riddick for a one-yard loss on a rush off left tackle in the second quarter.
- At Houston (10/2), started at linebacker and recorded five tackles, including two stops for loss and two quarterback pressures. Shot through the line and stuffed Lamar Miller for a three-yard loss on a rush off right end in the second quarter. Stopped Miller for no gain on a rush up the middle in the fourth quarter.
- Against Cleveland (10/16), started at linebacker and notched five tackles, including a sack and two quarterback pressures. Dropped Cody Kessler for a sack early in the opening stanza.
- At San Diego (11/6), played as a reserve at linebacker and tied for the team lead with 10 tackles, including a sack, a tackle for loss and a quarterback pressure. Stuffed Melvin Gordon for a two-yard loss on a rush off left tackle in the first quarter. Halted a Chargers' drive by dropping Philip Rivers for a seven-yard sack on third-and-16 in the second quarter.
- At Indianapolis (11/20), started at linebacker and recorded eight tackles. Tied for the team lead with a special teams tackle. Teamed with Angelo Blackson to stuff Frank Gore for no gain on a rush off right tackle in the first quarter. Combined with Derrick Morgan to stuff Gore for no gain on a

rush up the middle in the second stanza. Combined with Avery Williamson to stop Gore for no gain on a rush off right tackle late in the fourth quarter.

- At Chicago (11/27), saw significant action as a reserve at inside linebacker and registered eight tackles, including a stop for loss. Posted a team-best three passes defended, including his first interception of the season. Intercepted a Matt Barkley pass intended for Ben Braunecker and returned it 21 yards midway through the second quarter. Tackled Eddie Royal for a six-yard loss on a short pass in the second quarter. Broke up a pass intended for Jordan Howard in the final stanza. Batted down a pass intended for Daniel Brown at the goalline late in the fourth quarter.
- At Kansas City (12/18), started at linebacker and led the team with eight tackles, including two stops for loss. Stuffed Charcandrick West for a one-yard loss on a rush off right end in the second quarter. Stonewalled Spencer Ware for no gain on a third-and-goal rush from the one-yard line in the second quarter.
- Against Houston (1/1), started at linebacker and registered six tackles, including a stop for loss. Collected a special teams tackle on coverage units. Stopped Jonathan Grimes for a one-yard loss on a rush off right tackle early in the second quarter.

**2015 (16/12 - Tennessee):** Played in all 16 games with 12 starts at inside linebacker. Ranked second on the team with 110 tackles and third on the squad with five sacks. Registered seven tackles for loss, nine quarterback pressures, three passes defended, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Posted six special teams tackles on coverage units. Led or tied for the team lead in tackles five times in 2015 (vs. BUF, vs. ATL, at NO, at JAX, at NYJ). Tied for the team lead in sacks four times in 2015 (at CLE, vs. MIA, vs. CAR, at JAX). Tied for the team lead in quarterback pressures twice in 2015 (vs. MIA, vs. CAR). Led the team in passes defended once in 2015 (at IND). Led the team in tackles for loss once in 2015 (vs. MIA). Tied for the team lead in special teams tackles twice in 2015 (at CLE, vs. HOU).

- At Cleveland (9/20), saw action as a reserve at inside linebacker and amassed a sack and a forced fumble. Collected a special teams tackle on coverage units. Ended a Cleveland drive by sacking Johnny Manziel and forcing a fumble that was recovered by the Browns on third-and-10 in the third quarter.
- Against Buffalo (10/11), started at linebacker and led the team with 10 tackles. Stuffed Boobie Dixon for no gain on a rush up the middle in the second quarter.
- Against Miami (10/18), started at inside linebacker and tallied 11 tackles, including a sack, two stops for loss and a quarterback pressure. Stonewalled Lamar Miller for a two-yard loss on a rush up the middle in the second quarter. Ended a Dolphins' drive by dropping Ryan Tannehill for a 10-yard sack on third-and-10 early in the fourth quarter.
- Against Atlanta (10/25), started at inside linebacker and led the team with 11 tackles. Teamed with Avery Williamson to stuff Devonta Freeman for no gain on a rush off left guard early in the fourth quarter. Met fullback Patrick DiMarco in the air and stoned him for no gain on a third down goalline rush in the fourth quarter.
- At New Orleans (11/8), started at inside linebacker and tied for the team lead with 10 tackles, including a sack, a tackle for loss and a quarterback pressure. Notched a solo special teams stop. Sacked Drew Brees for an 11-yard sack in the third stanza.
- Against Carolina (11/15), started at inside linebacker and tallied 10 tackles, including a sack, two quarterback pressures and a stop for loss. Stuffed Jonathan Stewart for no gain on a rush up the middle in the first quarter. Collected a one-yard sack of Cam Newton in the third quarter. Shot through the line and stuffed Stewart for no gain on a third-down goalline rush in the final stanza.
- At Jacksonville (11/19), started at inside linebacker and tied for the team lead with six tackles, a sack, two stops for loss and a quarterback pressure. Dropped Blake Bortles for a six-yard sack in the second quarter. Combined with Avery Williamson to stuff Denard Robinson for no gain on a rush up the middle in the third quarter. Forced the Jaguars to attempt a field goal by stuffing Robinson for no gain on a third-and-two rush off right end in the third stanza.
- Against Jacksonville (12/6), started at inside linebacker and posted five tackles, a quarterback pressure, a pass defended and a fumble recovery for a touchdown. Combined with Brian Orakpo to stuff T.J. Yeldon for no gain on a rush off left tackle in the second quarter. Collected his first career touchdown by scooping up a botched shotgun snap and diving into the end zone for a three-yard fumble return for a score with 7:46 left to play in the fourth quarter.
- At N.Y. Jets (12/13), started at inside linebacker and tied for the team lead with eight tackles. Collected a special teams tackle on coverage units.

Combined with Angelo Blackson to stop Chris Ivory for no gain on a rush up the middle in the third quarter.

**2014 (16/16 - Tennessee):** Started all 16 games at linebacker and led the team with a career-high 134 tackles in his first season with the Titans. Tied for second on the team with two interceptions and tallied two and a half sacks, nine quarterback pressures, eight stops for loss and four passes defended. Notched two special teams tackles on coverage units. Led or tied for the team lead in tackles six times in 2014 (at KC, at CIN, at IND, at WAS, vs. NYG, vs. IND). Tied for the team lead in sacks once in 2014 (at KC). Led or tied for the team lead in passes defended twice in 2014 (at IND, at WAS). Was voted a team captain for the 2014 season by his teammates.

- At Kansas City (9/7), started at linebacker and led the team with seven tackles, including a sack and a tackle for loss. Halted a Chiefs' drive by sacking Alex Smith for a three-yard loss on third-and-three on the first possession of the game.
- Against Dallas (9/14), started at linebacker and finished second on the team with 10 tackles. Teamed with Derrick Morgan to stop DeMarco Murray for no gain on a rush off left guard in the third quarter. Stopped Lance Dunbar for no gain on a rush up the middle in the fourth quarter.
- At Cincinnati (9/21), started at linebacker and led the team with 11 tackles, including a stop for loss. Stuffed Ryan Hewitt for no gain on rush up the middle late in the fourth quarter.
- At Indianapolis (9/28), started at linebacker and led the team with 12 tackles, two quarterback pressures, two passes defended, including an interception. Halted a Colts' drive by knocking down a pass intended for T.Y. Hilton on third-and-16 early in the first quarter. Set up the Titans first touchdown by intercepting an Andrew Luck pass intended for Hakeem Nicks late in the second quarter. Stopped Trent Richardson for no gain on a rush off right end early in the fourth quarter.
- At Washington (10/19), started at inside linebacker and led the team with 11 tackles, an interception and a quarterback pressure. Combined with Kamerion Wimbley to stuff Alfred Morris for a three-yard loss on a rush off left end in the second quarter. Set up a Titans' touchdown by intercepting a Kirk Cousins pass intended for Andre Roberts in the second quarter.
- Against Houston (10/26), started at linebacker and posted eight tackles, including two tackles for loss and a quarterback pressure. Stuffed Arian Foster for a two-yard loss on a rush off right tackle in the opening quarter. Combined with Al Woods to stuff Alfred Blue for a one-yard loss on a rush off right tackle late in the third quarter. Stonewalled Blue for a one-yard loss on a rush off right tackle in the fourth quarter.
- Against N.Y. Giants (12/7), played in his 100th career regular season game. Started at linebacker and tied for the team lead with 10 tackles, including a stop for loss and a quarterback pressure. Combined with Ropati Pitoitua to stop Andre Williams for no gain on a rush off right tackle in the fourth quarter.
- At Jacksonville (12/18), started at linebacker and registered five tackles, including a sack, a stop for loss and a quarterback pressure. Collected a special teams stop on coverage units. Dropped Blake Bortles for a five-yard sack in the third quarter.

**2013 (14/10, 3/0 - Denver):** Was elected a defensive season captain, played 14 games with 10 starts. Earned his third career Broncos' Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year award. Ranked second on the team with 83 tackles and added 1.5 sacks, one interception, three tackles for a loss, eight quarterback hits, four pass breakups and one forced fumble. Played all three playoff contests, finishing with seven tackles.

- Against Baltimore (9/5), finished second on the club with 10 tackles, including half a sack, one tackle for a loss, two quarterback hits and one pass breakup.
- At N.Y. Giants (9/15), finished second with seven tackles and added a pass breakup and a quarterback hit.
- Against Oakland (9/23), tied for the team lead with eight tackles and added half a sack and a pair of quarterback hits.
- Against Philadelphia (9/29), recorded half a sack and finished third on the team with eight tackles.
- At New England (11/24), set a career high with 15 tackles and forced one fumble.
- At Kansas City (12/1), intercepted Alex Smith's pass in the end zone.

**2012 (15/14, 1/1 - Denver):** Appeared in 15 regular season games, starting a career-high 14 contests, and led the club with 114 tackles (70 solo), to go along with 5.5 sacks (47.5 yds.), three interceptions (40 yds.),

six passes defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Added three special teams stops. Became the only player in the NFL in 2012—and just the 12th player in the last 30 years—to record at least 100 tackles, five sacks and three interceptions in a single season. Named to *USA Today's* All-Joe Team and earned the Darrent Williams Good Guy Award from the Denver chapter of the Pro Football Writers of America.

- Against New Orleans (10/28), earned the AFC Defensive Player of the Week Award honors after setting or matching career highs in nearly every defensive category and becoming the first Bronco to post one sack, one interception and one forced fumble in the same game.
- At Cincinnati (11/4), finished with a career-high 14 tackles to lead all players.
- Against Cleveland (12/23), set a career high with 1.5 sacks.
- Against Baltimore (1/12), tied for second on the team with seven tackles in Denver's AFC Divisional Playoff Game.

**2011 (15/7, 2/0 - Denver):** Played in 15 games, starting a then career-high seven contests. Ranked second on the team with 87 tackles to go along with two passes defended and two forced fumbles. Led the club with 10 special teams tackles for the second consecutive season and the third time in his four years with the team. Added one forced fumble on the kickoff coverage unit. Saw action in both of Denver's postseason games and collected one special teams stop.

- Against Cincinnati (9/18), matched a career-high with 13 tackles (10 solo) and added a pass defended.
- Against Chicago (12/11), forced a Marion Barber fumble in Denver territory in overtime to prevent a game-winning score and set up Denver's offense for the go-ahead field goal.

**2010 (11/3 - Denver):** Was named a team captain for the third consecutive year. Played 11 games with three starts and totaled 23 tackles, including one sack for 10 yards, in addition to a team-leading 15 special teams stops. Tied for fifth in the NFL with 1.36 special teams tackles per game.

- Against San Diego (1/2), recorded his first career sack for 10 yards in the regular-season finale.

**2009 (16/0 - Denver):** Was named a team captain. Played as a reserve in all 16 games and posted 35 tackles, one interception, two pass breakups and one forced fumble. Tied for fourth on the team with nine special teams tackles.

- At Cincinnati (9/13), made his first career interception.
- Against Pittsburgh (11/9), placed second on the club with seven tackles.
- At Kansas City (12/6), had three special teams tackles.

**2008 (16/6 - Denver):** Entered the NFL with the Broncos as a college free agent on April 28. Played all 16 games with six starts as a rookie and ranked eighth on the team with 54 tackles while adding one pass breakup and one forced fumble. Tied for the team lead with 11 special-teams tackles, including eight stops on kickoff coverage that tied for the club best. Was the only Broncos player to rank among the top eight on the team in both defensive tackles and special-teams stops. Tied for fourth in the league in unassisted tackles (36) according to press box totals during a stretch from Weeks 10-14 when he logged the first five starts of his NFL career. Also saw time at safety late in the year.

- At N.Y. Jets (11/30), registered a season-best 13 stops.

#### COLLEGE:

- Earned first-team All-Southeastern Conference honors during each of his final two seasons at the University of Kentucky, where he played 47 career games with 42 starts and led the Wildcats in tackles during each of his last three years.
- Concluded his collegiate career ranked eighth in Wildcats history with 395 tackles (259 solo) while adding 6.5 sacks (48 yds.), two interceptions, 12 pass breakups, seven forced fumbles and seven fumble recoveries.
- As a senior, led the SEC in tackles per game (10.6) and tied for 14th in the nation with 139 total stops.
- Posted 122 tackles as a junior that represented the second-highest total in the SEC and ranked 14th in the nation.
- Garnered honorable mention All-SEC accolades as a sophomore with 100 tackles (75 solo).
- Began his collegiate career as a strong safety before switching to linebacker midway through his freshman season. Earned freshman all-

conference honors and became the first-ever Kentucky freshman to serve as a team captain.

- Earned a bachelor's degree in social work from Kentucky.

**PERSONAL:**

- Married to Veronica and the couple has a son, Greyson, and a daughter, Noah Elle.
- Was named the Georgia Class AAA Defensive Player of the Year by the *Atlanta Journal-Constitution* after posting 125 tackles as a senior at

LaGrange (Ga.) High School. Helped his team post a 51-3 combined record during his prep career and win two state championships.

- Named the Broncos' nominee for the Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year in 2010-11 and earned the Darrent Williams Good Guy Award from the Denver chapter of the Pro Football Writers of America in 2012.
