TITANS-BILLS SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES

FISHER TO REACH MARK ACHIEVED BY JUST NINE OTHERS: This Sunday **Jeff Fisher** will roam the sidelines for the 250th time in a regular season or playoff game as the head coach of the Titans/Oilers franchise.

Fisher, whose career record is 135-114, will become the 10th NFL head coach to reach 250 games with one team. **Bill Cowher** and **Joe Gibbs** were the most recent additions to the list, both reaching the mark in 2006.

BULLUCK MOVING UP TEAM'S IRON MAN LIST: Last week at San Francisco, Titans linebacker **Keith Bulluck** moved up the team's all-time list for most consecutive games played.

Bulluck appeared in a game for the 129th straight time, moving ahead of former running back **Eddie George** for sixth place on the list. If Bulluck plays in the next seven contests, he will rank fourth.

MOST INDIVIDUAL 1,000-YARD RUSHERS SINCE 1996: The Titans selected former running back **Eddie George** in the first round of the 1996 NFL Draft. Since that time, no team has had more 1,000-yard rushing seasons than the Titans.

George went over 1,000 yards seven times during his career (1996-00, 2002-03). Following his departure, **Chris Brown** (2004), **Travis Henry** (2006), **LenDale White** (2007) and **Chris Johnson** (2008) all accomplished the same.

Entering this week's game against the Bills, Johnson is within 41 rushing yards of crossing the 1,000-yard threshold for the second consecutive season.

That would give the Titans an NFL-high twelve 1,000-yard rushers since the start of the 1996 campaign, breaking a tie with the New York Jets.

OFFENSIVE LINE PROTECTING QUARTERBACKS: The Titans are tied with the Indianapolis Colts for fewest sacks allowed in 2009. Both teams have given up seven total sacks in eight games. In 2008, the Titans were sacked 12 times to tie the Denver Broncos for the league lead.

Combining both years, the Titans are second only to the Colts in sacks allowed per pass play. When a Titans quarterback has dropped back to pass since the start of the 2008 campaign, they have been sacked 2.67 percent of the time.

The Titans have had the same starting five offensive linemen for 21 of the 24 regular season games in 2008 and 2009: left tackle **Michael Roos**, left guard **Eugene Amano**, center **Kevin Mawae**, right guard **Jake Scott** and right tackle **David Stewart**. **Leroy Harris** is the one additional player that has started on the offensive line in that time, including last week at San Francisco in place of Stewart.
