TITANS-COLTS SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES

PASSER RATING DURING LAST FIVE WEEKS: Since **Vince Young** was inserted into the starting lineup five weeks ago, he has been one of the NFL's most efficient quarterbacks, completing 83 passes for 1,010 yards, four touchdowns and one interception in 127 attempts.

His passer rating over the last five weeks of 96.9 ranks sixth in the NFL and second in the AFC.

BULLUCK APPROACHES 100 AGAIN: Titans linebacker **Keith Bulluck** leads the Titans with 96 tackles in 2009. He is on the verge of producing his eighth consecutive 100-tackle season, extending his franchise record (since 1979).

Since entering the starting lineup at the start of the 2002 season, Bulluck has not missed a single game and has eclipsed the 100-tackle mark in every campaign. He is scheduled to make his 125th consecutive start this weekend at Indianapolis.

Tackles are not considered an official NFL statistic. The Titans use tackle figures based on coaches' review of game film.

**Bulluck needs four tackles to post eighth consecutive 100-tackle season

MATCHUP FEATURES TWO OF TOP FIVE ROOKIE RECEIVERS: This week's game features two of the NFL's top five rookies on the league receiving chart.

Tennessee's first-round pick and the 30th overall selection in the 2008 NFL Draft, **Kenny Britt**, is tied with Chicago's **Johnny Knox** for fourth in the league among rookies with 33 receptions. Britt's 33rd catch produced the game-winning, 10-yard touchdown in last Sunday's 20-17 victory over the Arizona Cardinals.

Austin Collie was selected by the Colts in the fourth round (127th overall) of the draft. His 43 catches rank first on the rookie list, ahead of **Percy Harvin** (42), **Jeremy Maclin** (42), Britt and Knox.

Britt and Collie were the sixth and 19th wide receivers chosen in the draft, respectively.

MAGIC NUMBER 17: For the last three weeks, the Titans have held their opponents to exactly 17 points and have won all three games. They defeated the Bills 41-17 (Nov. 15), the Texans 20-17 (Nov. 23) and the Cardinals 20-17 (Nov. 29). One additional opponent was held below 17 points during the Titans' current five-game winning streak, the Jacksonville Jaguars on Nov. 1 (30-13).

Limiting opponents to 17 points or less has been a key ingredient in the Titans' winning formula over the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2008 season, the Titans are 16-2 when their opponents score 17 points or less. Only the Baltimore Ravens have held as many opponents to 17 points or less in that time period. During the 2008 season, the Titans only played three games when they allowed more than 17 points.

The Titans' .889 winning percentage when allowing opponents 17 or fewer points is above the league average of .829 in the same time period. Their opponents this week, the Indianapolis Colts, are a perfect 14-0.
